JULIA’S JEWELS

Believing

In July when I heard International Lions President Wing-Kun Tam speak of his dream to see one million trees planted across the globe, I was inspired, but I must admit I was also a little skeptical. Planting one million trees seemed like a daunting effort and one that might take a while to accomplish. Nevertheless, swept up in the excitement of International Convention and the beauty of the Million Tree project, I made it my goal to see that District F clubs plant 1500 trees- virtually one for every member in the district. President Tam believes it can be done and I believe it can be done.

Today (Sept 12, 2011) President Tam’s dream is a reality (See the LCI website for details). My dream is off to a bit slower pace. I only know of one tree actually having been planted in District F –maybe two. But as I have traveled to your clubs, many of you have agreed that trees are needed in areas around your communities.

President Rodney Forsness and the members of the Benton City Club have planted the first tree in the District F 1500 Tree project. PDG Lion Melba Fujiura of Sunnyside club has promised one tree and Sunnyside Lion Trish Combs, a new member of the Sunnyside Club, has donated 49 trees – one for every club in the district. I owe a tree to Moscow Central, Troy and Clarkston, as well as Naches Sunshine and Chinook Pass clubs. So that is 5 more trees. President Andy of Washtucna said his club wants to plant 20 trees downtown as a beautification project. President Jon of Goldendale, site of a recent forest fire, is also on board with the tree planting efforts. PDG Bill Shepherd has a bunch of seedlings in his yard free for the taking and more trees are coming. Only 1,495 trees to go!

So how does that relate to membership? In a quaint and, I believe, an outdated effort to purge clubs of non paying members, July 1, 2011 saw a dramatic rush to drop members. Since July I have seen District F drop 78 members, many in good standing, some who didn’t pay dues or chose not to come to club meetings. I get it that non-paying members can drag a club treasury down. I hope, however, that every possible measure was made to reunite those members with the family of Lions before they were dropped. I encourage all clubs to conduct a survey to determine why so many members don’t feel the connection to the “We Serve” motto of Lions. Try to determine why new members don’t feel like a part of the Lion family. Our membership is at a dangerous low- But I am not disheartened. We have added 16 new members – only 40 new members to go to reach June 30’s 1,530 – And I know we can surpass that goal.

I believe that District F is the best district in MD 19 and I truly believe that membership number will begin to steadily grow back to 1500 and – even better, surpass my dream of seeing trees spout up and to see membership expand.

Lions need only ask that volunteer helping plant that tree in the city park if she or she want to join the largest and most humanitarian club in the world.

ASK and believe the offer will be accepted. That is the kind of optimism this District needs and as Lions I believe we have.

YOUTH OUTREACH/PEACE POSTER CONTEST PZC MARGE SHEPHERD, CHAIR

A TIME SENSITIVE YOUTH PROJECT-- LCI PEACE POSTER CONTEST 2011--2012

"CHILDREN KNOW PEACE" is the theme for this year's Lions International Peace Poster Contest. This 20 year old annual competition encourages young people worldwide to visually express their visions of peace. With more than 300,000 participants each year, the contest is one of Lions Clubs International's largest and most recognizable youth programs.

My personal goal is for all District F Clubs to sponsor one or more Peace Poster Contests in their communities. NOW IS THE TIME TO PURCHASE A PEACE POSTER KIT FROM CLUB SUPPLIES Kits are available through October 1st.

This is an easy project with a very short time frame. I encourage all club presidents to present this to their next Board of Directors meeting.

Students ages eleven (11) through thirteen (13) are asked to draw a poster that reflects their ideas about this year's theme, "CHILDREN KNOW PEACE". A short essay (25 words or less) that describes how their poster reflects the theme should accompany the poster. Please read the rules and remind the students to follow them. It would be a shame if a beautiful poster was disqualified because a rule was ignored.

The time frame for judging begins at the local level and should be completed in time for the winning poster to be delivered to District Governor Julia by November 15, 2011. She arranges for the poster to be judged at the District level and forwards the winning poster to the Multiple District Office for judging in late January.

Winners can be recognized in several ways, with cash awards, ribbons, certificates or art supplies. The grand prize winner will receive a trip to the United Nations accompanied by parents and teacher plus a \$5,000.00 prize. There are also 23 Merit winners who receive certificates and a cash award from Lions Clubs International.

A club can sponsor more than one contest BUT must purchase a kit for each group. The contest is not limited to schools but is open to all types of youth groups.

Like all of us, that member joined Lions because of the good work we do and they wanted to be part of helping to improve the community and to provide service to others so let these members know they are valued members of your club and their attendance, input and help is needed for the club to accomplish its goals. Then put them to work! Assign that member to an active committee or have them head up a new project. Let's keep our existing members and recruit a few new ones

LIONS MULTIPLE DISTRICTS select and submit one winning photo to the INTERNATIONAL contest. March 1, 2012 is the deadline for multiple districts to submit one 8" x 10" photograph and an official entry form (available on the Lions Website) signed by the Council Chairperson to Lions Headquarters.

LCI will display Multiple District-level entries at the annual Lions International Convention. Registered convention attendees will vote for their favorite photos. An award will be presented to the winning photographers. The six (five category winners and the Best of Show.) winning photos will appear on the Lions Web site.
