From Interstate 82: Take Exit 96 off I-82 head north on SR 225 into Benton City. This street changes names from 1<sup>st</sup>, Babs and 9<sup>th</sup> St., but you stay on this street till you see Ellen Ave, turn left (on the right side is Les Schwab Tire Center) There will be 1 stop sign and the Lions Club is on the right.

From SR 240: The Benton City turnoff from SR 240 onto SR 225 South is halfway between mile posts 20 and 21 and is clearly marked with a sign saying Benton City. If you are driving east on SR 240, you will make a right turn. Follow SR 225 south for almost 10 miles. ### **LCIF: PDG Melba Fujiura, District F LCIF Coordinator**

#### One Shot, One Life

Measles are so easy to prevent, a safe and simple vaccine that cost under US\$1 is all that is needed to ensure a lifetime of immunity. However, 450 children still die each day from measles-related complications. In addition, measles infections are on the rise again in places like North America where it had ceased to be a serious problem since 2002. Now more than ever, Lions can make an important impact on the health of children at home and abroad by support of measles control efforts.

In October 2011, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation challenged Lions to mobilize US\$10 million for the Measles Initiative. To show support for Lions commitment to community health and Lions capacity to meet this challenge, Gates awarded LCIF a US\$5million matching grant for One Shot, One Life. Put it differently, for each \$2 raised by Lions, the Gates Foundation is donating \$1. US\$10 million from Lions + US\$5 million from Gates = US\$15 million for the Measles Initiative. Please contribute generously to LCIF.

Some facts about LERC: The operation of services provided are all paid by donations from Lions clubs in Washington and Idaho, and everyone that "works" there is a volunteer. There are no paid employees.

Most of the monetary donations come from District C, but recently donations have increased from clubs outside of District C. I would like to see each club in District F make some kind of donation to LERC this year.

Earlier this year all the clubs were sent a letter asking for a donation of \$100 or less. I hope a few clubs have taken this request to heart. The services provided by LERC are helping people all over the world receive the gift of sight through these recycled eyeglasses.

In fact, it is hoped that Pasco will soon have everything in place to become a Hub where all collected glasses are pre-sorted for the LERC facility so they don't have as much work to do on their end and can get right to the business of identifying and packaging. LERC has collection boxes that can be purchased (about \$6 per box) that can be personalized with your club's information. ### **THE PILOT PROGRAM-**

The Pilot Program is moving forward and should be implemented by the beginning of the 2012/2013 school year. The need for more School Screening Days in our area should benefit from this program. Details are still being worked out. The basic idea is to make available to schools, with small student enrollments, all the necessary equipment to screen for vision and hearing. This would not be a smaller version of our new LHSU but everything would arrive in a closed unit (similar to a U-Haul trailer). One of the requirements would be for the school to provide a room where the equipment could be set up. I NEED YOUR HELP in identifying areas in District F where this type unit could be used. If possible, your reply would be helpful before February 4<sup>th</sup>, our next Foundation meeting. This new project is on the agenda and your questions will be helpful. Wanda held an audience of approx 65 people spellbound while she told her story of how she lost her sight, and how Lions helped her find Leader Dogs and regain her independence. She told us ways that we can help, such as a \$50 dollar donation can provide a white cane to someone who may not be able to afford one. Wanda was very enlightening, entertaining and there was a lot of laughter, too. At the end of the evening, the Yakima Lions Club presented Wanda with a \$15,000 check for Leader Dogs. A very generous Yakima resident had remembered the Lions in her will, allowing the Yakima Lions to donate \$15,000 to each of Leader Dogs for the Blind as well as the WA School for the Blind. Also included in the donation list were The Low Vision Clinic in Yakima, and Guide Dogs of America. After the workshop, Wanda spent some one on one time with three young women who were sight impaired that had come to the event. She gave them information on how to get signed up for a Leader Dog, as well as allowing them to "test drive" Leader Dog Harley as none of them had ever used a Leader Dog.
