Lions International Peace Poster Contest is an international contest that encourages children ages 11-13 to creatively express what peace means to them. The 2012-2013 contest themes is "IMAGINE PEACE". The contest allows students to share their individual thoughts of peace with others, so we may all have greater tolerance and international understanding.

Lions Clubs around the world are being encouraged to sponsor students eleven (11) through thirteen (13) to enter the Lions International Peace Poster contest for 2012/2013. Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school(s) or an ORGANIZED YOUTH GROUP, such as Boys & Girls Clubs, Scout Programs, Church Youth Groups, etc. Some restrictions apply but Lions Clubs are allowed to sponsor the contest in Leo Clubs and Scout Units they sponsor.

The Peace Poster kits are now available through Club Supplies at LCI. To order the 2012/2013 kit; ask for PPK 2012/13. The cost plus shipping is less than \$20.00 US.

NEW CONTEST THIS YEAR—Lions International Essay Contest.
